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FOREWORD

This year we celebrate the fifth Franschhoek Chamber Music Festival, hence the inclusion of Peter Heidrich's Happy Birthday Variations written in 2002 for the fifth birthday of one of the world's finest chamber orchestras, Kremerata Baltica. And whilst not intending any comparison to Gidon Kremer's now iconic orchestra, the extent to which the Franschhoek Chamber Music Festival also seems to be following a trajectory of success and popularity is beyond my wildest dreams.

Miclen LaiPang's awe-inspiring performances at the 2025 Franschhoek Chamber Music Festival led to an unprecedented invitation for him to appear for two consecutive years. His association with so many CPO musicians has been cemented through several concerto engagements with the orchestra in addition to various chamber music collaborations.

Following Ariane Hearing's sublime performance of Mozart's D Minor Piano Concerto with the CPO in January 2025, an invitation to Franschhoek seemed very natural. And if two internationally based guest artists are not enough, Lothar Hensel, bandoneonist extraordinaire, will bring additional flare to the already eclectic programme this year with sounds from Argentina and beyond.

While anchoring the programmes on popular classics by Mozart, Bach, Beethoven and Schubert that have stood the test of time, the 2026 Franschhoek Chamber Music Festival includes three special features: A programme of Tango music and other music featuring the bandoneon highlights the popular crossover culture prevalent in so many international music festivals today. This year also features a programme dedicated to the music of women composers, all of whom produced musical gems, but who were overlooked due to gender inequality of the age in which they lived. And lastly, our



local composer slot goes to Hans Huyssen, whose music has for several decades married Western Classical musical tradition with period instrument and African instrument influence.

I would like to offer my sincerest thanks to my colleagues (players and management alike) in the CPO, for giving of their time and energy well beyond the call of duty to produce these special concerts.

I wish all our patrons a wonderful festival.

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CAPE TOWN PHILHARMONIC ORCHESTRA

Since 1914 when the forerunner of the CPO was established in Cape Town, this orchestra has been acknowledged as the oldest, busiest, and foremost orchestra in Africa. The multifunctional role it has as the presenter of high-quality symphony concerts with leading national and international soloists embraces so much – from the partnership it has with Cape Town City Ballet, Cape Ballet Africa, Cape Town Opera and societies such as G&S, to the many schools and communities across the Cape Flats and greater Cape Town for which it presents a series of concerts each year. It serves the region and all its people by presenting music of all genres from a concert celebrating the First Nations to often neglected South Africa composers, its youth development programme encompasses Masidlale, its entry level, grassroots mother-tongue training project, through the CPO Music Academy, training strings and wind ensembles, and the flagship Cape Town Philharmonic Youth Orchestra and the Cape Town Philharmonic Youth Wind Ensemble. Several of the young musicians regularly perform as ad hoc musicians with the CPO.

GUEST ARTISTS AND SOLOISTS



MICLEN LAIPANG

Violinist Miclen LaiPang has swiftly established himself as one of the most compelling and versatile artists of his generation, earning international recognition as a soloist, chamber musician, concertmaster, educator, and curator. Praised by *The New York Times* as “a force to be reckoned with” and by *Die Welt* as “a musician of daring virtuosity with noble elegance,” he has performed at leading venues including Carnegie Hall, Vienna Musikverein, Hamburg Elbphilharmonie, Wigmore Hall, Royal Albert Hall, and Berlin Philharmonie. His acclaimed recordings on Sony RCA Red Seal and Naxos include a chart-topping arrangement of Beethoven’s “Kreuzer” Sonata, which reached No. 1 on Apple Music Classical in over 40 countries. Recently signed with Delos, his solo album will be released in 2026. A dedicated chamber musician, he is the violinist of Trio Zadig and founder of M Sphère in Paris, as well as Artistic Director of the Miesbach Kammermusikfestival and co-director of several international chamber series. He performs on the 1707 Stradivari ‘Charles Castleman, ex-Marquis de Champeaux,’ generously loaned by the Queen Elisabeth Music Chapel, and the Dominique Peccatte ‘ex-Eugène Ysaÿe’ bow.



ARIANE HAERING

Swiss pianist Ariane Haering began learning the piano at the age of five, studying at the North Carolina School of the Arts in the US, then graduating from the Lausanne Conservatory with Honours at the age of 20. She has won major prizes in several competitions including the Swiss Youth Music Competition and the Eurovision 1992 and reached the semi-final of the Clara Haskil Competition. She has toured the Americas including, Canada, Asia and Europe and is now a much sought-after pianist and chamber musician in Austria, where she now lives. She is co-founder of the Alban Berg Ensemble which has begun its 10th season at the Vienna Konzerthaus. Her appearances in the major Salzburg music festivals confirm her as an internationally-renowned artist. She was a CPO soloist in 2025 and has been appointed Senior Lecturer at the Mozarteum University in Salzburg.



LOTHAR HENSEL

Like the bandoneon, Lothar Hensel was born in the region of Niederrhein. Hensel studied the bandoneon in Buenos Aires and Paris with famous tango musicians and is now one of the most-sought after bandoneon soloists in the world. He has been performing with very well-known symphony orchestras such as the Berlin Philharmonic Orchestra. He has played the famous Bandoneon Concerto from Astor Piazzolla more often than the composer himself and was brought to Cape Town to perform with the CPO in a symphony concert and in the open-air at Kirstenbosch in early 2026.



JOSÉ DIAS

Portuguese-born pianist José Dias appears regularly in concert halls and festivals in South Africa. Recent performances have taken him to various countries in Africa and Europe, as well as to China, in venues such as the Berliner Philharmonie, the Shanghai Symphony Hall and the Temple of Heaven in Beijing.

José has been musical director of Cape Town Opera's international productions *African Angels*, *African Passion* and *Horizons*, and several operas, including the premiere of Conrad Asman's *Trial by Media*, about Oscar Pistorius' trial. His performance as "Manny" alongside Sandra Prinsloo in McNally's Master Class earned him a Woordtrofee nomination for supporting actor. He has received several awards from Woordfees, KKNK, Aardklop, and two kykNET Fiëstas. He is a sought-after piano teacher and vocal coach, and a part-time lecturer at Stellenbosch University's Music Department.



GRANT BRÄSLER

Grant Bräsler started organ lessons at the age of 14 with Garmon Ashby and continued his music studies with Dr Barry Smith at UCT, where he completed his BMus Hons in 1998. He was awarded the Claude Brown Organ Scholarship for post-matric studies at the Diocesan College (Bishops) in 1993 and was the winner of the Adcock Ingram Music Competition in 1996 at UCT and the Stephanus Zondagh Overseas Organ Scholarship from UNISA in 2000. He is Organist and Master of the Choristers at St George's Cathedral.



FARIDA BACHAROVA

CPO guestconcertmaster Farida Bacharova came to South Africa in 1995, having graduated from the Gnesin Musical Pedagogical College and the Moscow State Tchaikovsky Conservatory. At the age of 26, she became concertmaster of the 'Maly' Moscow Philharmonic Orchestra. She also performed with the USSR Ministry of Culture Symphony Orchestra, and the Moscow Academic Philharmonic Orchestra. She has been on many international tours and worked with conductors like Menuhin, Ashkenazy, Ozawa, Rozdestvensky, Mazur and Svetlanov. She is an Associate Professor and Head of Strings at UCT's South African College of Music. She often performs as a soloist and chamber musician in and around Cape Town.



SUZANNE MARTENS

Suzanne Martens, a CPO guest concertmaster, is currently Senior Lecturer and Head of the Department of Music at the University of Stellenbosch. She studied violin at the University of Pretoria and obtained a BMus and BMus Hons before continuing her studies in The Netherlands and Austria. She then obtained a Master's Degree in Chamber Music from the University of Stellenbosch and a Doctorate in Performing Arts from the University of Pretoria. As a student she won several competitions and prizes. In June 2001, she became concertmaster of the Cape Town Philharmonic Orchestra, before taking up her position in Stellenbosch, and since 2005 has been a guest leader of the CPO. She is an active chamber musician.



PHILIP MARTENS

Philip Martens completed his Performers' Diploma and BMus Honours Degree at the University of Cape Town with Jürgen Schwietering and Farida Bacharova. He has been playing in various ensembles and has also featured as soloist with the CPO and Cape Town Baroque Orchestra. He was appointed Deputy Concertmaster of CPO in 2017 after moving up through the ranks over the last 20 years and became concertmaster in 2023. He also enjoys playing chamber music with the Amici Quartet alongside family members Peter and Suzanne Martens.



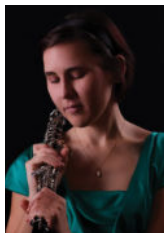
DAVID THOMPSON

Born in Scotland, David began playing trumpet at the age of nine, taught by his father, a trombonist with the BBC Scottish Orchestra. He played in the Clyde Bank Brass Band, graduated from Leeds College of Music, and played in dance bands in the north of England before attending the National Centre for Orchestral Studies (NCOS) in London, and freelancing with various orchestras and bands. He worked with the Bournemouth Symphony Orchestra and BBC Northern Symphony Orchestra, and then in 1986 came to South Africa as Alternate Principal Trumpet, playing with the Cape Town Symphony Orchestra and Solid Brass Quintet. In 2000, he became Principal Trumpet of the CPO. He teaches trumpet at UCT.



GABRIELE VON DÜRCKHEIM

Principal flute of the Cape Town Philharmonic Orchestra since 2002, Gabriele received her first flute lessons from Eva Tamassy while still at primary school in Stellenbosch. After finishing her Higher Licentiate at the University of Stellenbosch, she continued her studies in England with Trevor Wye. Gabriele has won several prizes and awards including Category prize of the ATKV Musiq competition and Oude Meester Music Competition, and has been active as a flute teacher at UCT and schools. She has regularly performed as soloist and ensemble player, and has also been a member of several orchestras, including the Malaysian Philharmonic Orchestra and the South African National Youth Orchestra.



LISA WHITE

Lisa White joined the Cape Town Philharmonic Orchestra as principal oboist in 2018. She received a BMus degree from UCT and an MMus from the University of New Mexico, where she studied under Kevin Vigneau. A versatile orchestral player, Lisa has performed with the Free State Symphony, Eastern Cape Philharmonic, New Mexico Philharmonic, and the Santa Fe Symphony. Her enthusiasm for chamber music is evident in collaborations with colleagues, including performances in this festival and as a member of the Cape Town Philharmonic Wind Quintet. Complementing her performance career, Lisa teaches at the Beau Soleil Music Centre.

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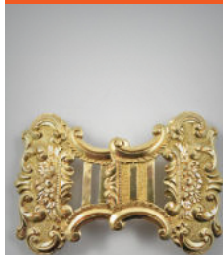
